

Dear Parents

In previous newsletters I have addressed the issue of social media (especially the Digital Age) and **kindly requested parents to take control or at least have an active interest in their children's usage** of this important aspect of the modern world. While I still focus on other dangers and there impact on relationships and behaviour the following was recently published:

The digital age is having a detrimental effect on children's visual abilities as well as other aspects of their physical and mental development.

"After 30 years of specialised work with vision-related problems in children, Port Elizabeth optometrist Robert Nettl says he has seen a frightening escalation in these problems this year and that urgent intervention is needed."

A very interesting article with statistics (on the side) revealing the impact on our children. This makes a teachers job even more difficult and adds to the numerous other challenges they face **every day. While we had a strict "NO" cell phone policy at school we find that some parents do not always support us.** Applying rules at home in this regard is now fast becoming a necessity.

Tablets and cell phones are very useful tools and we cannot wish them away, control of these **however is becoming a reality facing parents as this will influence your child's future whether you like it or not.** The *critical* issue is that it is your responsibility to do so and that you cannot wait for someone else to do it for you.

Please encourage family time where you make time to talk to your child and allow them to talk to you. Doing something together is of utmost importance and an ideal time is during the preparation of supper, washing dishes or having a meal.

Boundaries need to be set on how we use our digital devices, what we say on social media and even more frightening what we watch on TV. Please be aware that not all cartoons or children orientated programs are suitable. Age restriction and the practical implementation thereof is also a vital aspect: what children watch on TV might shock you or perhaps we have already lost the moral value argument without even knowing it?

You might find that you are a prisoner of the modern world losing the beauty of sunset, sunrise, clouds, wild life, trees, flowers and most important your family.

We will always find a reason to use our phones; always find an excuse for not showing respect and/ or for violating rules or policies. As a well-known professor put it: **"The excuses have become more creative and then we even believe them ourselves."**

This is a mouthful and we definitely need time to reflect on it and to evaluate our own situation. This will take time and a strong will to change and to implement creative measures which will be sustainable and beneficial for our children and their future.

I would like to challenge all families to apply one rule : If we all start the day by making our own bed, we will have one task successful completed every day - **it's always nice to get into a made up bed at night.**





'n Baie interessante artikel met statistieke (hier langsaan) wat die impak op ons duidelik maak. Dit maak 'n onderwyser se werk net nog moeiliker en dra by tot verskeie ander uitdagings wat hulle van dag tot dag moet trotseer. Hoewel ons 'n streng "GEEN" selfoon-beleid het, ondervind ons dat ouers ons nie ondersteun nie. Om reëls in hierdie verband tuis toe te pas, word nou 'n werklikheid.

Tablette en selfone is baie handig en hoewel ons dit nie kan wegwijs nie, word die beheer daarvan 'n realiteit wat ouers in die gesig staar, aangesien dit u kind se toekoms gaan beïnvloed, of u daarvan hou of nie. Die kern van die saak is dat dit u verantwoordelikheid is en dat u nie kan wag vir iemand anders om verantwoordelikheid te neem nie.

Moedig asseblief gesinstyd aan wanneer u tyd inruim om met u kind te gesels en hom/haar toelaat om met u te gesels. Dit is uiterst belangrik om dinge saam te doen en die ideale geleentheid is terwyl u aandete voorberei, skottelgoed was of saam aansit vir etc.

Ons moet grense stel aan hoe ons digitale toestelle gebruik, wat ons op sosiale media kwytraak en, selfs meer nadelig, die TV-programme wat ons kyk. Nie alle strokiesprente of programme wat op kinders gerig is, is gesikte kykmateriaal nie. Ouderdomsbeperkings en die praktiese implementering daarvan is uiterst belangrik. Ons mag geskok wees oor watter TV-programme kinders kyk – of het ons dalk reeds die morele waardes-argument verloor sonder dat ons daarvan bewus is?

U mag dalk vind dat u 'n gevangene van die moderne wêreld is en reeds die skoonheid van 'n sonsondergang, sonsopkoms, wolke, diere, bome, blomme en belangrikste van alles, u gesin, verloor het.

Ons sal altyd 'n rede vind om ons foon te gebruik; altyd 'n verskoning vind om nie respek te be-toon nie en om reëls en beleide te verontagsaam. 'n Bekende professor het gesê: "Die verskonings raak meer kreatief en uiteindelik glo ons dit self."

Dit is 'n mondvol en ons het beslis tyd nodig om hieroor te besin en ons eie situasie te evalueer. Dit sal tyd en 'n definitiewe wil tot verandering verg, asook om kreatiewe maatreëls in plek te stel wat volhoubaar en tot voordeel van ons kinders en hul toekoms sal wees.

Intussen daag ek elke gesin uit om aanvanklik net een reël toe te pas. Laat elkeen sy eie bed opmaak as die eerste takie vir elke dag. Dan sal een takie elke dag suksesvol afgehandel wees en dit is ook baie lekker om saans in 'n opgemaakte bed te slaap.
