Kwaliteitsonderrig en Leer

Hoewel ons al jare lank ons leerlinge se vordering monitor, het ons onlangs 'n baie goeie en omvattende resultaatvoorlegging van die Nelson Mandelabaai Distrik ontvang.

In teenstelling met wat ouers glo, word ons vraestelle, uitslae en remediëringstrategieë deur Distriksoptenare nagegaan en gemonitor.

Ons bestee ure aan die aantekening van die vordering van ons leerlinge. Individuale ondersteuning vir leerlinge wat Kwaliteitsonderrig en Leer nodig het, is van die uiterste belang wanneer ons kinders Gr 8 in die hoëskool bereik. Ons het 7 jaar om hulle voor te berei en die statistieke en resultate bewys duidelik dat ons ons uitstekend van ons taak kwyt. 'n Onlangse verslag van hoëskole, wat deur ons aangevra is, toon dat ons ons leerlinge deeglik voorberei. Dit is noodsaaklik om met hoëskole saam te werk en gesprek te voer, aangesien ons leerlinge vir hoëskool moet voorberei. Hoewel ons kan sê dat ons leerlinge tot op standaard voorberei is, moet ons nog werk aan hoë kognitiewe vlak-vrae, lees en begrip.

Dit is 'n aansienlike sprong van Gr 7 tot 8 en ook van Gr 3 tot 4. Aantekening word reeds sedert 2014 vir elke graad en elke leerling gedoen en intervensie en ondersteuning word diensooreenkomsdig beplan. Aan die ander kant moet ons ook die KABV-leerplan volg en aan die Departement verslag doen i.v.m. vordering. Ons uitslae word ook deur die Departement gemonitor en met die resultaatvoorlegging vir die 2de kwartaal kan ons werk met die werk en resultate van skole in die Metro vergelyk word.

Binne die Nelson Mandelabaaidistrik is daar 71,3% gemiddeld van leerlinge wat die uitkomste van Gr R tot 7 behaal. Dit daal tot 'n kommerwekkende 25,9% gemiddeld behaal in Gr 8. In Gr 12 styg dit tot 63,3% as gevolg van harde werk. Meer as 95% van Sunridge-leerlinge behaal egter dieselfde resultate as in hul Gr 7-jaar en 'n groot aantal toon verbetering. Dit is ook waar dat 'n paar (1%) nie kan byhou nie.

As ons na die toekoms kyk, merk ons op dat die uiters hoë uitsakpersentasie in die eerste jaar op universiteit 'n aanduiding is dat ons ons onderrigmetodes in heroënskou moet neem. Ons standaard is hoog en die maatstaf wat ons gestel het, is nie onderhandelbaar nie, gesien in die lig van die terugvoer en resultate wat hoëskole aan ons deurgee.

Met die verslag wat ons van die Departement ontvang het, kan ons ook elke graad en elke vak vergelyk. Ons presteer gemiddeld 25% hoër as die distriksgemiddeld – dit is egter nie 'n gegeue nie.

Dit is 'n wanopvatting dat 'n hoë persentasie wat deur 'n leerling behaal word, 'n aanduiding is dat die onderrigstandaard van 'n hoë gehalte is. Die feit dat daar 'n afname is in leerlinge wat 50% in Wiskunde, Natuurwetenskappe, Sosiale Wetenskappe en Tegnologie verwerf terwyl hulle die leer tot by Gr 12 klim, is 'n duidelike bewys dat hulle geneig is om uit te sak met die styging van moeilikhedsvlakte. Hoewel ons voormalige leerlinge bybly en onder die toppresteerders tel, sal ons steeds die vordering jaarliks monitor.

Statistieke toon ook dat ons leerlinge oor die algemeen beter vir die Desembereksamen voorberei en dat die resultate hoër as in Junie is. Die standaard van die vraestelle bly egter dieselfde.

Navoring wys dat ouers 'n kind meer as drie keer moet roep voor hulle 'n reaksie kry – dit is die 'voer-met-'n-lepel' konsep of tweede (derde) kans. Dit beteken 'n onderwyser moet 'n vraag weer lees, die opdrag weer verduidelik en meer as een keer vra vir 'n projek om voltooi of ingehandig te word. Dit maak die lewe moeilik vir ons kinders wanneer hulle hoëskool toe gaan, aangesien dit nie aanvaarbare praktyk is wat 'n positiewe bydrae tot onderrig lewer nie.

Roep een keer, verduidelik een keer, verwag van hulle om 'n opdrag te lees en uit te voer, om betyds te wees, betyds in te handig, verantwoordbaar te wees en dinge self te doen, is konsepte wat ons dringend by ons kinders moet inskerp.

Quality Learning and Teaching

Although we have been following our learners progress for years we recently had a very good and comprehensive result presentation from the Nelson Mandela Bay District.

Contrary to what parents believe our District Officials do check and monitor question papers, results and remedial strategies.

We spend hours on "mapping" the progress of our learners. Individual support for learners in need of Quality Learning and Teaching is of the utmost importance when our children reach grade 8. We get 7 years to prepare them and the statistics and results clearly show that we are doing an excellent job.

A recent report from High Schools, requested by us, shows that our learners are well prepared. Talking and working with High Schools is essential as we need to prepare the learners and although we can say that our learners are up to standard we still need to work on high cognitive level questions, reading and comprehension.

As the jump from grade 7 to 8 seems to be considerable it's the same with grade 3 to 4. "Mapping" since 2014 for each grade and each learner is looked at and we plan accordingly with interventions and support. We also need to follow the CAPS curriculum and report on progress to the Department on a monthly basis. Our results are also monitored by the Department and with the Term 2 Result Presentation we can compare our work and results with schools in the Metro.

Within the Nelson Mandela Bay District we see on average 71,3% of learners achieving the outcomes from grade R to 7. This falls to an alarming 25,9% average achieved in grade 8. As a result of hard work, this climbs to 63,6% in grade 12. Over 95% of the Sunridge learners are however achieving the same results as in their grade 7 year and quite a large number are improving. It's also true that a few do not cope at all.

Moving forward we also note the very high fall out percentage in the first year at University which shows that we need to look at how we teach. Our standard is high and the "BAR" set is not negotiable as it is clearly supported by the feedback and results from High Schools.

With the report received from the Department we can also compare each grade and each subject. We are on average performing 25% higher than the district average, this is however not a given.


It's a misconception that a high percentage obtained by a learner is an indication that the standard of education is of a high quality. Looking at the decline of learners achieving 50% in Mathematics, Natural Science, Social Science and Technology as they climb the ladder to grade 12 clearly indicates that as the difficulty level rises they tend to fall out. Although our past learners are keeping up and are under the top performers, we will continue to monitor the progress yearly.

Statistics also show that on average our learners prepare better for the December exam and the results are better than in June. The standard of the question papers remains the same.

Research shows that mum or dad call more than three times before children react, at school it materialise as the "spoon-feeding" concept or second (third) chance. It boils down to the teacher reading the question again, explaining the instruction and asking more than once for a task to be completed or handed in. This burns our children in High School as it's not an acceptable practice contributing positively to education.

Call once, explain once, expect them to read an instruction and follow it, be on time, hand in on time, be accountable and do it yourself is some concepts we need to imbed in our children as a matter of urgency.
