

Dear Parents

With the holiday coming up I need to address a few issues which put our learners and education at risk. The common defence is that this comes from the school and that children are "learning or seeing" this at school. I beg to differ!

The "dare game" is fast becoming a major issue at school with different "dares" being used to play this game. This includes fighting, stealing, foul language and who knows what else. Please address this as a matter of urgency with your child, this will not be tolerated and we will act decisively. The fact that it is a game does not justify the wrong, in some cases parents will be liable and this is a friendly warning to all. It is banned at school.

Language used is also fast becoming a serious problem - the language used by some young children is shocking. We do get a few incidents at school but in general it is the language they use and hear after school that is now "slipping" out as they put it! Shocking to hear what they watch or listen to on television or social media. Age restriction seems to be missing and again it reflects badly, while so many are innocent but still overhear it on social media, in public, in the car or at home. We need to communicate to our children that it is wrong.

I do not need to explain, the school rules about cell phones are well known. Parents still allow children to use them and bring them to school within direct violation of the rule. The phones (SIM) are on parents ID's and the misuse therefore reflects on parents. We were tolerant up to now but will enforce the rule with full force from next term. Tracking your child due to safety reasons is fine but it still needs to be within the school rules, as supported by the Department of Education.

Take note that as parents you are also responsible for what is on the phone and its directories.

It is expected of teachers to keep the high moral ground and not to bad mouth parents even when provoked and when children behave badly, they still need to act accordingly. It is unfortunately the very same children and parents who seem to think that they may say what they please. This is also an aspect directly linked to social media and I again warn parents, teachers and children that the allegations and language used on social media will eventually backfire on you. WhatsApp's, Facebook, Instagram etc. are something to be used with respect and accountability.

The following was sent by a fellow Principal to a group of Principals, to thank us. This left me thinking of the influence each of us have on other people's lives. I share this with respect.

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Geagte Ouers

Met die naderende vakansie moet ek 'n paar kwessies wat ons kinders en die onderwys in gevaar stel, aanspreek. Die algemene opvatting is dat hierdie probleme by die skool ontstaan het en dat kinders die dinge "by die skool aanleer of sien". Dit is nie waar nie!

Die uitdaagspeletjie ("dare game") versprei soos 'n veldbrand, met verskillende "uitdagings" wat gebruik word om die speletjie te speel. Dit sluit bakleiery, diefstal, vuil taal en vele meer in. Bespreek hierdie kwessie asseblief as 'n saak van dringendheid met u kind – hierdie speletjie sal nie geduld word nie en ons sal daadwerklik optree. Die feit dat dit 'n speletjie is, maak dit nie reg nie en in sommige gevalle sal die ouers aanspreeklik gehou word. Hierdie is 'n vriendelike waarskuwing – die speletjie is verbode by die skool.

Taalgebruik word ook vinnig 'n ernstige probleem – jong kinders se taalgebruik is skokkend. Ons kry wel met 'n paar gevalle by die skool te doen, maar oor die algemeen is dit die taal wat hulle ná skool gebruik en hoor, wat nou "uitglip" soos hulle dit stel. Dit is skokkend om te hoor waarna hulle op sosiale media kyk of luister. Ouderdomsperke is afwesig en dit stel die skool in 'n slegte lig. Daar is talle onskuldige kinders, maar hulle kom op sosiale media, in die openbaar, in die motor of tuis daarmee in aanraking. Ons moet ons kinders op die hart druk dat dit verkeerd is.

Ek hoef nie te verduidelik nie – die reëls oor selfone is welbekend. Ouers laat kinders steeds toe om die reëls te verbreek deur dit skool toe te bring en te gebruik. Die fone (SIM) is aan die ouers se ID gekoppel en die ouers is dus aanspreeklik vir wangebruik. Ons was tot dusver lankmoedig, maar die reëls sal van volgende kwartaal af streng toegepas word. Dit is goed en wel om vir veiligheidsredes te weet waar u kind is, maar dit moet ingevolge die skoolreëls, soos deur die Departement van Onderwys ondersteun, geskied.

As ouer moet u ook kennis neem dat u vir die foon en sy adreslys verantwoordelik is.

Daar word van onderwysers verwag om koel en kalm te bly en nie te reageer wanneer ouers hulle uitlok nie en wanneer kinders hulle sleg gedra, moet hulle steeds rustig bly. Dit is ongelukkig dieselfde kinders en ouers wat dink dat hulle kan sê wat hulle wil. Dit het 'n direkte verband met sosiale media en ek waarsku ouers, onderwysers en kinders dat die bewerings en taal op sosiale media uiteindelik in u gesig sal ontplof. Whatsapp, Facebook, Instagram, ens. moet met respek en verantwoordelikheid gebruik word.

Die volgende is deur 'n mede-Skoolhoof aan ons gestuur, 'n woord van dankie aan 'n groep Skoolhoofde. Ek deel dit met groot respek met u.

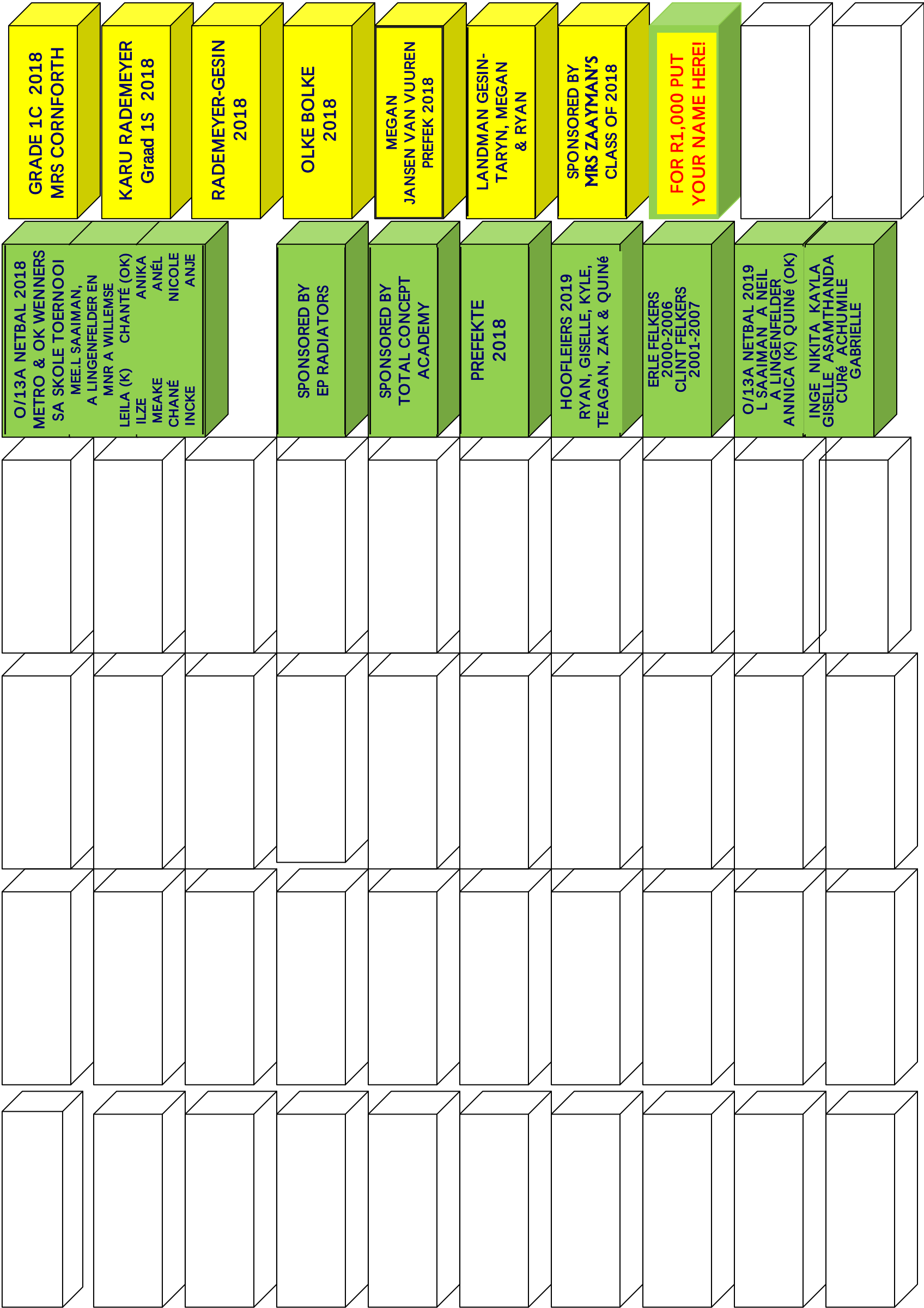
