To later learn she was still marking and preparing for the next day make me sad but very proud. It's my child's teacher what can I do for her?"

Yes, madam, I know. In reality it boils down to an average of 11 hours some days but it is also a reality that some staff put in up to 15 hours per day. The fact they do not get time for a lunch break is true, they eat on the run and that is why they deserve respect. Thank you for seeing this and thank you for being a caring and loving parent. All they need is RESPECT.

With a change in assembly we can now allow all our learners to sit on chairs and enjoy this bi-weekly meeting with a difference. A more personal meeting in groups. One week English and one week Afrikaans has also been implemented for assembly and what a privilege to listen to our prefects addressing our learners in their second language. Ons weet vir sommige ouers is hierdie soos 'n "kraan wat lek", MAAR ouers word aangemoedig om die nuusbrieue te lees, sommige dateer terug tot 2018, maar bevat 'n goudmyn van inligting. U word vriendelik daaraan herinner om alle aangeleenthede met respek te hanteer.

"Meneer, weet u dat u onderwyspersoneel om 07:15 begin werk? Ek was verstom om selfs elke dag 'n hele paar van hulle reeds om 06:00 by die skool te sien, waar hulle in hul klasse wag om ons kinders te ontvang. Hulle werk tot 13:30 of 14:00 sonder tyd vir middagete en dan is hulle weer op 'n drafstap op pad na die buitemuurse aktiwiteite. Ek sien hoe hulle die skool enige tyd tussen 14:30 en 18:00 verlaat. Ek het net ná 20.00 'n e-pos aan die onderwysers gestuur oor huiswerk wat ek nie verstaan het nie en sy was so vriendelik en hulpvaardig. Ek het later verneem dat sy nog besig was met werk en voorbereiding vir die volgende dag - dit het my met hartseer, maar ook met trots, gevul. Hierdie is my kind se onderwysers - wat kan ek vir haar doen?"

Ja, Mevrou, ek weet. In werklikheid beteken dit gemiddeld 11 uur per dag vir sommige onderwysers, maar sommige mense **werk tot 15 uur per dag. Die feit dat hulle nie tyd kry vir middagete nie, is vanselfsprekend aangesien hulle op 'n drafstap moet eet - daarom verdien hulle respek. Dankie dat u dit raakgesien het en 'n liefdevolle omgee-ouer is. Al wat ons onderwysers nodig het, is RESPEK.**

Verandering

Met die verandering in saalbyeenkomste kan al ons leerders nou op stoele sit en hierdie tweeweeklikse byeenkoms geniet. **Dit is 'n meer persoonlike vergadering in groepe. Die een week is Engels en die volgende week Afrikaans, ook by saalbyeenkomste, en wat 'n voorreg om te hoor hoe ons prefekte die leerders in hul tweede taal aanspreek. Die personeel het hierdie projek ter ondersteuning van ons leerders se tweedetaal-vlakke by die skool van stapel gestuur.**

Lees is nou 'n integrale deel van elke dag en hoofrekene is aan die orde van die dag. Ons moet hierdie inisiatiewe geesdriftig ondersteun sodat ons 'n soliede grondslag vir die toekoms kan lê.

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
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
