Reading Ability of Learners

This topic has often been addressed in newsletters and although many parents have supported us from home, there were also many who have not. We have limited time at school and with insufficient support at home, your child will lose out.

In the media they speak about the poor reading ability of Grade 4 learners in South Africa and are teeming with different strategies. Although we are one of the exceptions to the rule, we still want to raise the bar to a higher level.

Our decision to equip the computer classes with a high quality reading programme was not very popular. It was not well received and many of the children rushed through the reading and tried to manipulate the results.

The results showed a different story as the 850 words per minute achieved by some learners could not be repeated and was not possible with a one-on-one basis with the teacher. The computer class is first and foremost a reading class, the skills to handle the programme are essential and currently more important for the future of our learners. We still allow for the extras and other IT skills but only once the reading has been successfully completed.

To read with comprehension is vital and an essential skill that must be developed. This is not negotiable and within a short time frame we have already seen a dramatic improvement. We will clamp down on the 14% of learners who still fool around and I have no doubt you will soon hear that computers are no longer a fun class anymore!

50% of the 86% of learners who do not fool around are 100% on track with an extremely high international standard of reading. We need this figure to reach 65% within the next 7 months. 47% of the 86% are behind and although not in the red zone, still not good enough. We urge parents to continuously encourage reading at home to support this skill as this needs to improve before the end of 2023. 2% of the 86% are way behind the international level - parents will be informed in due course as most of the reading work should be done and practiced at home.

1% of our learners are already on Grade 8 level and although we are satisfied there is still lot of work to do - we would like this to be at least 12% by the end of the year. Please support the reading homework your teacher sends home, encourage your child to read and reward them - this is a huge investment in their future. We aim to issue individual reading reports through this program as soon as possible.

School Blazers

These are compulsory for Grade 4 - 7 for assembly as well as **daily during the second and third term**. Please ensure your child is dressed correctly.

Geagte Ouers

Leerders se Leesvermoë

Hierdie onderwerp is al dikwels in nuusbriewe aangespreek en hoewel talle ouers ons tuis ondersteun, was daar ook vele wat dit nie gedoen het nie. By die skool is ons tyd beperk en met onvoldoende ondersteuning tuis, is u kind aan die verloorkant.

In die pers word groot gewag gemaak van die powere leesvermoë van Gr 4-leerders in Suid-Afrika en dit wemel van strategieë. Hoewel ons een van die uitsonderings op die reël is, wil ons steeds hoër hoogtes bereik.

Ons besluit om die rekenaarklasse met 'n leesprogram van uiters hoë gehalte toe te rus, was nie gewild nie. Dit is nie goed ontvang nie en kinders het oorhaastig gelees en die uitslae probeer manipuleer.

Die uitslae spreek egter boekdele, want die 850 woorde per minuut wat deur sommige leerders bereik word, is nie moontlik met 'n een-tot-een grondslag saam met die onderwyser nie. Die rekenaarklas is in die eerste plek 'n leesklas, want programvaardighede is noodsaaklik en tans meer belangrik vir die toekoms van ons leerders. Ekstras en ander IT-vaardighede word steeds aangebied, maar slegs nadat die leeswerk suksesvol voltooi is.

Om met begrip te lees, is 'n uiters belangrike vaardigheid wat opgeskerp moet word. Dit is nie onderhandelbaar nie en binne 'n kort tydjie het ons reeds dramatiese verbetering gesien. Hoewel 14 % van leerders nog gekseer, sal ons dit gou hoksla. U gaan vir seker hoor dat rekenaars nie meer 'n lekker klas is nie!

50 % van die 86 % van leerders wat nie gekseer nie, is 100 % op koers met 'n uiters hoë internasionale leesstandaard. Binne die volgende sewe maande moet hierdie syfer 65 % bereik. 47 % van die 86 % is agter – hoewel nie in die rooi sone nie, maar wel nie goed genoeg nie. Ons versoek ouers dringend om u kinders aan te moedig om tuis te lees en om hierdie vaardigheid voortdurend op te skerp, want dit moet voor die einde van 2023 verbetering toon. Met 2 % van die 86 % wat nie naasteby op die internasionale vlak is nie, sal ouers te geleëntyd in kennis gestel word, want die meeste van die leeswerk moet tuis gedoen en geoefen word.

1 % van ons leerders is reeds op Gr 8-vlak en hoewel ons tevrede is, lê daar heelwat werk voor, want teen die einde van die jaar wil ons minstens 12 % bereik. Ondersteun asseblief die leeswerk wat die onderwysers huis toe stuur, moedig u kinders aan en beloon hulle – dit is 'n wonderlike belegging in hul toekoms. Ons beoog om so spoedig moontlik deur hierdie program leesrapporte uit te reik.

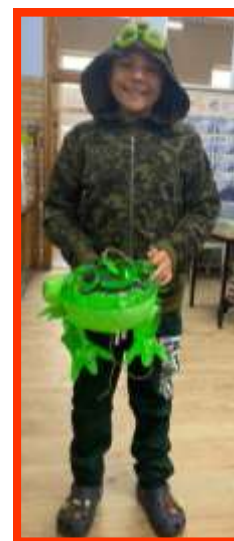
